The presenter will describe the Skilled Dialogue approach, emphasizing its use as a tool identifying and tapping into the strengths and resources of children and families, especially those whose values, language(s) and/or behaviors are diverse from those typically characterized as the "norm". The Skilled Dialogue approach (Barrera & Kramer, 1996; Barrera, Corso & Macpherson, 2003) is based on action research over the past 10 years with EC and ECSE practitioners and families in multiple contexts. Skilled Dialogue's two main skills - Anchored Understanding of Diversity and 3rd Space - will be discussed: **Anchored Understanding of Diversity** emphasizes a relational and contextualized understanding of differences based on personal, face-to-face exchanges of "stories" rather than on preset conceptualizations. **3rd Space** asks practitioners to make a shift from exclusive dualistic (i.e., "either-or") dichotomies to inclusive and integrative perspectives that focus on the complementary aspects of diverse beliefs, values, or behaviors that, at first glance, may seem to contradict or inhibit desired practices or outcomes.

Isaura Barrera is Associate Professor of Special Education, Univ. of New Mexico and Coordinator, Multicultural ECSE Graduate Program at UNM. She has been the principal investigator of several grants on Preparing Personnel to Create Competent and Caring EC Environments Responsive to Diversity in Children and Families. Some of her publications include: Barrera, I., Skilled Dialogue.

An article in the *Chronicle of Higher Education* (December 5, 2003) highlights a national study by Mary Ann Mason of the Univ. of California at Berkeley that addressed the question of the seminar in the physical and behavioral sciences. She found that women who have children within five years of earning their doctorate are almost 30% less likely than women without children to ever have a tenure-track position. Furthermore, women who had babies within five years of earning their Ph.D.'s were more than 20% less likely to achieve tenure than men who became fathers early on. Several graduate students and Leigh Leslie from the Univ. of Maryland conducted a survey to see if Mason's findings hold true for academics in the family field. Three to four panelists will also be selected based on the timing of the birth of their first child. Panelists will include individuals whose children were born while they were in graduate school and individuals whose children were born at different points in the tenure review process. Panelists will discuss their decision-making process in deciding when to have children and their perspectives on the impact of the timing on their career. An effort will be made to include both male and female panelists and to have panelists from different types of families (heterosexual married, single, and same-sex partnership) represented.

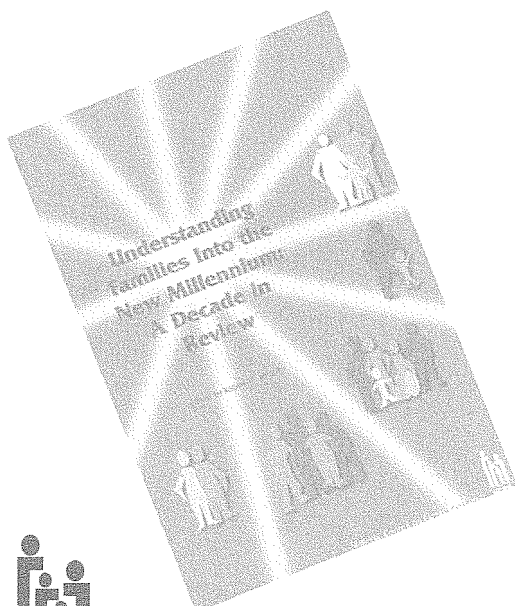

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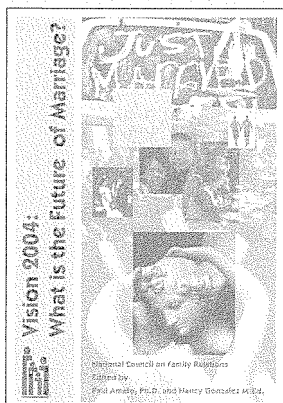
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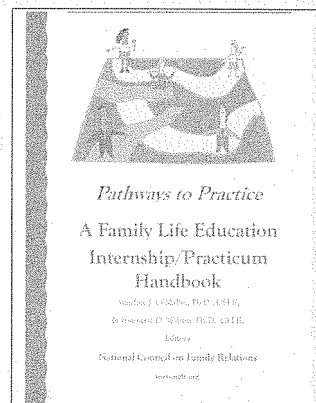
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Family Life Education Internship/Practicum Handbook

✦ Frequently check for messages at the Message Board, your room phone flasher.

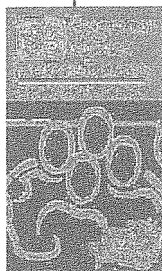
