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
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

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

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The Hospitalized Child and His Family

Edited by J. Alex Haller, Jr.

This is a book with a mission: to bring home to doctors, nurses, and other hospital personnel the need to regard the hospitalized child as a person, and not merely as the subject of surgery or other treatment. The contributors all share the belief that family-centered pediatric care is a valid medical concept of proven effectiveness. But whereas pediatric personnel in large hospitals have become increasingly convinced of the therapeutic value of creating a hospital environment similar to the child's own home, many paramedical personnel and physicians have shown a surprising lack of interest. Hence the hope of the contributors that while the latter may ignore books published by non-doctors, they may pay attention to one by their colleagues.

Adapted from lectures sponsored by the Children's Medical and Surgical Center of The Johns Hopkins Hospital, these essays discuss the preparation of a child for an operation in his home and in the hospital, the educational needs of the hospitalized child, hospital play facilities, the advantages of a mother living in with her hospitalized child, and the child and his family at home after hospitalization.

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
