## THE NEW COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION

Arthur Dunham, University of Michigan

It is the thesis of this book that out of the sweeping social changes of the last decade, with the attendant turmoil, has come what might properly be called "the new community organization"—an enlarged role for community organization and new mass programs, along with a greatly increased demand for persons trained in community work.
