## **General Conference Information**

Conference Registration Fees. All persons attending the NCFR Conference, including program presenters must register and pay the registration fee. Every person must stop at the registration desk located at the Corporate Travel Desk in the West Lobby of the Hyatt Hotel upon arrival (including those who have pre-registered). At that time packets and name tags will be given. Check the "Ongoing Events" Section of this program for a listing of registration hours.




