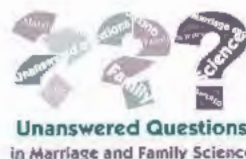

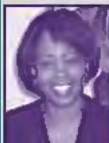

While much of the social science literature regarding African American fathers continues to focus on perceived negatives and pathologies, an entire segment of Black men are fathers who want to, are, and have been involved with their children. This symposium offers a perspective on involved, child-engaged men giving them a voice to share some of their stories, and to discuss several successful community-based programs that train dads who desire to be involved with their children. These men likely hold the key to resolve many of the problems associated with absent fathers.

**Shane Price: A Father to Four Generations, Julie Landsman** Shares the story of a man who was reared by caring and loving grandparents. As an adolescent, he fell by the wayside and got involved in "life on the streets." Eventually he found the spiritual side of himself and commenced a more responsible lifestyle, learning to care for his own children and others in the community. He now works to enhance and improve relationships and interactions among males in the community.



WHEREAS: It is fitting that we recognize the special contributions and needs of families in our society; and

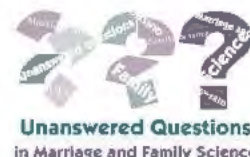
