### PREFACE

The family, as a subject of both analytical and popular study, has grown in interest and concern over recent years. Family curriculums in elementary, junior and senior high, and post-secondary programs are experiencing one of their most creative, exciting periods of development. New areas of inquiry, new methods of study are evolving.

Paradoxically, educational funding cutbacks, and national economic woes in general, have placed the future of family education in a rather precarious position. Decreasing enrollments in some sectors, attractive financial opportunities in other fields of study, etc., have contributed to this problem.

In order to recognize and verify all of the graduate family programs the need has surfaced for a specialized guidebook. The closest corollary to such a guide, the third edition of *Student Perspectives* published by the National Council on Family Relations in the spring of 1976, is very out of date. And, university catalogs offer a poor substitute for obtaining comparative, detailed information about graduate family programs.

A fresh listing of 66 United States graduate family programs and five Canadian programs was compiled in 1981 from the following sources: Student Perspectives; the Index of Majors 1979-1980, second edition, published by the College Board, New York; information provided by the National Council on Family Relations; and an announcement "call" in two of the National Council's Newsletters. A questionnaire was mailed to the department heads of all of these programs.

The extremely broad program diversity in the family area necessitates a careful analysis of programs. In many cases the name of a program can convey its scope, in other cases a study of the actual program is required. The following 71 graduate family programs represent those programs falling clearly in a family domain. With many schools beginning to offer new graduate family programs, and a trend towards greater interdisciplinary family programs, the following listing is actually an underestimate of the total number of program endeavors currently underway. Indeed, many institutions are moving towards more family-related teaching, research, and application in areas as diverse as law and medicine.

Career information is particularly noteworthy. Because of the breadth of the family field, it has often been difficult to pinpoint specific job opportunities beyond teaching and research. The data collected on roles students have assumed upon graduation from the program, and

institutions students have worked for should prove especially rich. Unfortunately, space did not permit the inclusion of all the specific roles and institutions provided. This section does, however, show the professional versatility a family degree can offer.

With this guide as a background resource, interested users should contact those programs that hold particular interest for them. Whether interest lies in areas such as teaching, business, social service, research, government, industry, administration, or private practice, this guide can prove valuable. Educational researchers may pursue statistical analyses of this data in order to gain more summary perspectives. It is hoped that this guide will be updated frequently to provide current and complete information on graduate family programs on a continual basis.

"Thank you's" extend to many individuals who were instrumental in the development of this material. Above all, Dr. Ruth H. Jewson, Executive Officer, National Council on Family Relations; Dr. Marvin B. Sussman, Unidel Professor of Human Behavior, University of Delaware; and the Publications Committee of the National Council on Family Relations have made invaluable contributions.
